ORDER GRANTING DEBTOR THE SCO GROUP INC.'S MOTION TO ENFORCE THE AUTOMATIC STAY

THIS CAUSE came before the Court for hearing on November 6, 2007 at 10:00 a.m. upon the Debtor The SCO Group, Inc.'s Motion to Enforce the Automatic Stay (the "Motion") (Docket No. 69 and 173), SUSE's Special Opposition to SCO Group, Inc.'s Motion to "Enforce the Automatic Stay" (Docket No. 141 and No. 142). After reviewing the written submissions and hearing the arguments of counsel for the Debtors and SUSE Linux GmbH ("SUSE"), and taking into account the waivers and stipulations that SUSE made on the record at the hearing, which are incorporated herein by reference, it appearing that the relief requested is in the best interests of the Debtors' estates, their creditors and other parties in interest; that this Court has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 1334; that this is a core proceeding pursuant to 28 U.S.C. § 157(b)(2)(A); for the reasons stated on the record and after due deliberation and cause appearing therefor; it is

ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED THAT:

1. The Motion is GRANTED, as set forth herein.

- 2. The automatic stay under 11 U.S.C. §362(a) applies to the SUSE Arbitration¹ in its entirety, including all claims, counter-claims and defenses asserted by both SUSE and The SCO Group, Inc. ("SCO Group"). SUSE and SCO Group are, pursuant to 11 U.S.C. §362(a), stayed, restrained, and enjoined from continuing the SUSE Arbitration.
- 3. The Debtors shall serve this Order upon SUSE, through its counsel, as well as the Office of the U.S. Trustee and the 20 largest unsecured creditors of the Debtors.
 - 4. The Court reserves jurisdiction to enforce the terms of this Order.
