Before leaving I dropped by Microsoft's reception for user groups. Gates summary of the IBM announcement is that 75% of the 286/386 machines shipping summary or the 18M announcement is that 75% of the 280/386 machines shipping have 2MB or less and are thus Windows machine and that all they did was to cade a part of the remining 25%. It wasn't an appropriate place for me to challenge him or accuse of changing the story. Bill does seem to be upset at Jim's statement about Windows being clipped though is happy with the term capped. So I presume that clipped is thus the preferred term?

Speaking to Russ Werner after that, when Russ had repeated the assertion that Lotus (and Software Publishing) and reneged on their commitment to Windows he accepted that Microsoft didn't come through with their promise to create the Windows marketplace -- at least on that timescale -- and that Windows/3 is, in fact, a significant change in direction and not a continuatin of business as usual. I wouldn't expect them to acknowledge this publicly, but might be able to better explain the difference between whining and having the rules changed.
