# Novell's Multiple False Claims of UNIX Copyright Ownership

**May 28, 2003**

"Importantly, and contrary to SCO's assertions, SCO is not the owner of the UNIX copyrights."

SCO-EX-0094

**June 6, 2003**

Amendment No. 2  
"appears to support SCO's claim that ownership of certain copyrights for UNIX did transfer to SCO in 1996."

SCO-EX-0097

**August 4, 2003**

"SCO's claim to ownership of any copyrights in UNIX technologies must be rejected, and ownership of such rights instead remains with Novell."

SCO-EX-0105

**October 2003**

Novell obtains UNIX copyright registrations. Novell declared under oath to the U.S. Copyright Office "that it retains all or substantially all of the ownership of the copyrights in UNIX, including the U.S. Copyright Registration referenced above."

SCO-EX-0073

**January 13, 2004**

Novell reiterates its false claims of UNIX copyright ownership in its launch of its own Linux indemnification program.

SCO-EX-0059

**March 16, 2004**

Novell Vice President Chris Stone addresses SCO in his keynote speech at the Open Source Business Conference: "We still own UNIX."

SCO-EX-0519

**Dec 22, 2003 – Present**

Novell maintains a public webpage in which it "continues to assert ownership of the UNIX copyrights."
