Whenever Novell files suits, or whoever files suit to obtain release for the damages incurred as a result of Microsoft anticompetitive conduct in the DOS marketplace, there should be a claim for Tortuous Interference with Perspective Economic Advantage. This claim should be based on Microsoft's activity to input language into Windows which would make nonoperable with DR DOS. That is a tort claim for which punitive damages can be claimed, and should be claimed.
